
Psalm 104:1-2, 5-6, 10, 12, 13-14, 24, 35

1. Bless the Lord, O / my soul! †


O Lord, my God, you are / **great** indeed! * You are clothed with majesty and glory, robed in / *light as* **with** a cloak.

Psalm 16:5, 8, 9-10, 11






- 1. *O Lord*, my allotted portion and / **my** cup, * you it is / who hold **fast** my lot.

Let us sing to the Lord; he has co-ver'd him-self in glo-ry.




- 1. *I will* sing to the Lord, for he is gloriously tri/**um**phant; * horse and chariot he has / *cast in***to** the sea.

I will praise you, Lord, for you have res-cued me.




- 1. *I will* extol you, O Lord, for you / **drew** me clear * and did not let my enemies re/*joice* over me.

You will draw wa - ter joy - ful - ly from the springs of sal - va - tion.




- 1. God indeed is my / savior; *

Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11




Lord, you have the words of ev - er - last - ing life.




